

With every quarterly meeting we are going to highlight a book! February's book is:




300 Paper-pieced Quilt Blocks by Carol Doak

The book consists of 300 paper-pieced quilt blocks, ranging from different flowers, houses, and animals, to toys, etc. The book is a single resource for a large group of block designs.

Carol teaches you how to produce accurate patchwork even if you are a beginner. Through step-by-step instructions with accompanying photos, she teaches you how to make a paper foundation, how to cut your fabric and label them as well as joining the blocks in the end. Lots of paper-piecing tips are also included.



THE GLENDAY QUILT PATTERN GHQG FUNDRAISER



We are thrilled to bring to you the "Glenday" quilt pattern. The pattern for this unique and historically significant quilt will be available for purchase at our meeting.

Ronél Pistorius and Diana Vandeyar have worked together to bring to you this amazing opportunity to stitch a part of South African quilting history. Ronél was instrumental in spotting the potential of this extraordinary quilt on a GHQG visit to the Iziko Social History Centre in Cape Town. With the permission of the Iziko Social History Centre – Iziko Museums of South Africa, Diana wrote the pattern so we can all make our very own.

The Glenday quilt pattern is a must-have for traditional quilters and quilters who love historical reproductions. But the timelessness of this pattern is quite amazing, contemporary quilters who enjoy making scrap quilts or working from their stash will also love it. Let's not overlook modern quilters who, no doubt, will add their style to this versatile pattern.

Furthermore, if the original size of this quilt is daunting (and since this quilt is a medallion), alternate configurations can be made by sewing it up to a size that suits you.

The 22-page pattern includes photos and the history of the original quilt, detailed instructions, and full-size applique templates.

Price: R150 (all proceeds from the sale of the pattern go to the GHQG festival fund)

Samples of the quilt (original colour palette, scrappy original colour palette, total scrappy, and modern) will be displayed at the meeting. Wait till you see Ronél's version quilted by Stephanie Geldenhuys!

LITTLE QUILTS OF LOVE

RONEL PISTORIUS



Little Quilts of Love is a token of compassion from the worldwide quilting community to provide some solace to the grief of parents of stillborn babies. In the last year, we have made and distributed more than 1000 Little Quilts with the help of participating quilters. Isn't that great?

We have expanded this project to the whole of South Africa and are supplying all Mediclinic and Netcare Hospitals with Little Quilts. We are negotiating with Life Hospitals now and will send their stock soon. Some governmental hospitals are also benefitting from this project.

The logistics are a bit complicated as we distribute via the head offices of the hospitals, but experience showed that it does have a bigger impact

now as it has become part of their existing counselling protocols.

Our goals for 2024 are:

- 1. To finalize the registration of our Non-Profit Organization.
- 2. To open our account for financial donations, which could help with postage, printing of our labels and maybe even some fabrics or flannel for the backing.
- 3. To get a team of Little Quilt Ambassadors together, covering all areas in South Africa. Their responsibilities will be:
 - a. To keep quilters inspired to support the cause.
 - b. To distribute the labels, gather the quilts, and then send the Little Quilts back to us. (We do not want to encourage people to deliver directly to their local hospital as we will not get feedback through the right channels.)
- 4. To produce and distribute 1800 (current amount needed) best quality Little Quilts in South Africa.

How can you help?

- 1. Volunteer to be an Ambassador. If this is you, please WhatsApp me so we can get the ball rolling.
- 2. Make Little Quilts as many as you can commit to, and still stitch each one with lots of love.
- 3. Inspire others to join the movement!
- 4. Support your local LQOL Ambassador.

Our dream is slowly unfolding to provide every bereaved parent with a Little Quilt of Love.

The quilts:

- Between 50cm and 70cm big.
- No batting.
- · Backed with flannel (to keep it soft).
- No quilting needed, but if you do want to quilt it... keep it light and soft.
- No binding; we turn them over and topstitch the edge. If you prefer binding, it's totally fine.
- Regarding quality only one question: Would you feel comforted if you were in the position to receive this little blanket?

It is such a nice project to do as it takes no time, working away all the little scraps after a project is finished.




Fabulous to see so many quilters from around the world joining in. Have you seen the photos on social media?

When I was about 18 years old, we went to a shop that sold cotton fabric and we each got fabric for a log cabin top. Mom's colours were brown and beige, mine was pink and light turquoise blue. It was great fun sewing together and planning the layout. We had not heard of batting and quilting at that stage, so our tops were backed with sheeting topstitched around the edge and used like that on our beds.

It was only many years later when I started working at The Quilting Bug that I really learnt a lot and started quilting and collecting fabric. I belong to Seaside Quilters and the Art and Fiber Group, Fishhoek. I love fibre art; it challenges me to think outside the box. I also love the freedom of creating and exploring new ideas with what you have on hand.

This hobby has given me so many great friendships and a community that understands my passion for the craft.





SULENE VAN DER MERWE

I always loved any form of handicraft, especially sewing, and when I met Zelda Nolte in 2012 a new world opened for me – Quilting! She introduced me to Karen Huysamer's beautiful shop and when I saw all the beautiful fabric – I was hooked! Since then Zelda and I completed a few quilts together – always blocks – I am addicted to them!

Through the years I attended a lot of quilting classes, and for me, it was not always about the new technique that you learned, but the wonderful friendships that were formed while working on a project. As I quote from Marie du Toit – a quilting house has many rooms – and one of the rooms is handwork. In the past few years, I discovered the tremendous satisfaction in producing a project totally made by hand, and two "koekarretjie" (Yo-yo or Suffolk Puff) vests followed.



What is next? That is the amazing part – there are more than a lifetime's skills to learn and more than a century's fabric to use - so even if you reach 120 years, you will never get bored.
