Dear Good Hope Quilters...



All over, one hears a slogan for this year, as though we've been in a long sleep or a state of waiting, and now it's finally time to "come alive in '25". This is a year of purpose.

Each year, we speak of new beginnings and opportunities to do wonderful work with Patchwork. We do wonderful work anyway, but here's the challenge - are we giving purpose to our work? The question is posed not to overwhelm but to help us focus, to help us "come alive in '25'".

There are plenty of ways to get involved and to share your work, for a purpose. Sometimes these opportunities have a large audience and a wide impact; and sometimes the challenge is in your own quilting group. You can choose where and how to expose your talent and our beloved craft; and if you know why you want to do it, you will not

only achieve personally, but you will keep our craft alive. So, let's decide - this is the year we thrive.

Dress in red for the day and bring your works inspired by the colour red or by love. Come and share and show your Creations. You can make '25 come alive for others too.

I hope you're feeling exhilarated to make 2025 alive and engaging but remember you do need personal time too. What better way than slipping away to Wellington between 20-23 March or a winter break to Hermanus between 26-29 June for a quilt retreat. Look out for details on these two events.



GROUPS OF THE QUARTER F.A.C.T. AND CREATIVE QUILTERS

SHEILA WALWYN / SIMMY SCHOFIELD

Simmy (Simone Schofield) started CREATIVE QUILTERS in August 1999. Through her shop she found that many enthusiastic ladies were looking for a group to join and at the time the two other existing groups were full. A venue was found, and CREATIVE QUILTERS' first meeting was attended by 26 ladies. Since then, we have moved our venue to two different church halls and recently we moved to Trinity Presbyterian Church in Meadowridge.

We meet on the 3rd Saturday of every month from 2pm – 5pm. Because of the pressure put onto the same person to organise a varied meeting every month, we have divided our 42 members up into 6 small groups and each group gets to oversee their monthly meeting, providing tea and snacks, demo's, guest speakers and mini workshops.

After tea we always have SHOW AND TELL, and the works are photographed and sent out to the members after the meeting.

Our members have built up a wonderful friendship between us and we all really look forward to getting together.

F.A.C.T. (Fibre Artists Cape Town) was formed 17 years ago by a group of artists and quilt makers who wanted to pursue a different route of stitchery towards more of a fine art product. Some of us wanted to push our traditional quilt making to a different level and those who had previously worked in other artistic media wanted to try incorporating thread and fabric into their work. Over the years we have run mini workshops on monoprinting, working into organza with a soldering iron, producing works inspired by artists such as Rothko, making collaborative works in round-robin format, amongst others. For some years the group exhibited with other invited artists as F.A.C.T. and Friends at Nova Constantia. F.A.C.T.'s work was shown at the Stellenbosch Craft Art Gallery last year and currently the group has some work on display at the Art@39Long gallery in Groot Brak. We don't meet regularly but like to get together occasionally to view and be inspired by art exhibitions in the Cape Town, Stellenbosch and Hermanus areas, and to show work in progress.

Krummel Kwilters was founded in 2019, starting out in a church hall. Back then, transporting bags of fabric and notions every month was quite a hassle. My husband and I decided to host the group at our home on Saturdays, and so our story began, gathering around the pool table in my lounge.

Today, we are a group of nine women, ranging in age from 51 to 86 years old. We make use of any "crumbs" of fabric donated to us by the generous ladies of the GHQG to create various projects I teach.

We were incredibly fortunate to receive larger pieces of fabric from Esmé Gent, and I'm thrilled to say we're using them for a big upcoming project—I can't wait for us to get started!

Every donation, no matter how big or small, is deeply appreciated and put to good use. I also make a point of sharing these fabric crumbs with other groups to help spread the joy of quilting.

As we all rushed into 2025, how much thought were you able to give to exploring the lesser-known quilting techniques and ideas available? Our Guild Library has a large range of books waiting to inspire, educate, and help you to "reinvent the wheel" this year in your own quilting journey! I invite you to make good use of the excellent books available and I also challenge each one of us to make at least 1 item from a book taken out!

As the year begins, we are starting with a Postcard Swap with a sister guild in Canada. This promises fun, new relationships with fresh inspirations and a different perspective on how other people quilt; plus many other aspects. With this in mind, I have chosen 2 books to review in the hope that, for those who did sign up for the challenge, they will be able to spark new ideas! A fabric postcard is almost like a very-mini quilt, so to speak, and so the size presents its own challenges!





The theme for the postcard swap is "Welcome To My Country", and one of the books I thought would be a great source of ideas is *Quilt Africa* by Jenny Williamson and Pat Parker. It's one of the books available in our newest Library Catalogue, South African books, written by our own South African quilters! **Quilt Africa** has a myriad of ideas. There's so many template-options to use - from animals, people, and landscapes! Helpful techniques and tips can also be found in the book (even seasoned/experienced quilters need help sometimes). Gorgeous photography and easy to follow instructions make this a book to inspire any quilter, not just for the fabric postcard swap. Grab it before someone else does!

The Quilted Object (making things with quilt art techniques) by Ineke Berlyn

Another extremely inspirational book, which also happens to include a small Fabric Postcards section. A general idea of how a postcard swap works is given in the chapter's introduction as well as a variety of ideas for use in the making of a postcard.

You can definitely adapt these to fit the theme of our swap.

If you decided NOT to join the Postcard Swap - then you will still find this to be a really fun and ideasparking book. It includes interesting takes on bags, 3-dimensional boxes, experimental techniques, and that "All-Important Thing"... finishing techniques! There's projects to fit the beginners' to the experts' hands and capabilities; so don't be shy to acknowledge your talents.




